

The Conference will be held within the Faculty of Law: more precisely in the Golden, Red and Silver Lecture Hall (accessible via the main and the rear entrance, situated on the 1st floor of the new building – simply walk through the cafeteria and turn left towards the staircase leading you upwards).

Signs and support will be on hand to guide you to the halls and conference rooms.


<u>Means of Public transport:</u> no parking is available at the venue, thus we recommend using public transportation, coming on foot or using a nearby car park.
